The first female to run for Council in Richmond Heights was Antoinette Rowland. She petitioned for a seat in 1921, just one year after women received the right to vote. She was not elected. Female candidates for school board found better success. Maude Phypers was elected in 1931, and Celia Roach won in 1958.
