**Kiwanis Lodge Update**

The Kiwanis Lodge is in the process of getting some major updates over the next few weeks. The “Senior Hall” will have the floor replaced and a new enclosure over the ADA ramp and stairs will be constructed. The Senior Hall’s flooring will be replaced within the next week. The new floors will be lighter in color and durable to withstand the frequent space rental. Also, with the help of a \$50,000 2019 Community Development Supplemental Grant (CDSG) the construction for the enclosure will start in the next few weeks. The enclosure will cover the ADA ramp and the stairs to the entrance of the newly renovated lower level.

**RHPD Internet Exchange Spot**

As a service to our residents and visitors, the RHPD has established an “Internet Exchange Spot” for people who want to meet to exchange items they purchased online or elsewhere. The parking spot is located on the east side of the Police Department parking lot with a green sign designating the area. As an added safety feature, there is a motion activated video system in place.

**Deer Population**

The RH Service & Recreation Committee of Council are currently discussing and working hard to find a resolution for the increased deer population. One thing we can all do to help is to refrain from feeding the deer; Not only out of respect for your neighborhood but because it is against the law (**505.21 FEEDING OF NUISANCE ANIMALS PROHIBITED; EXEMPTIONS; SECURE OUTDOOR STORAGE OF REFUSE OR WASTE**). The risks from deer are a serious concern particularly with regards to traffic accidents and exposure to ticks which can carry Lyme disease. Secondary concerns involve their destruction of residents’ plants and vegetation. We truly appreciate your attention to and cooperation in this matter.
