RHFD is proud to participate in the Aluminum Cans for Burned Children (ACBC). Through ACBC, aluminum beverage cans are collected, recycled and the proceeds are used for safety education, a summer and winter camp for burn survivors and to buy non-medical items not covered by health insurance to aid in the healing process. 28 beverage cans = 1 pound of aluminum.
