If you are left without power for more than 5 minutes please call **1-888-LIGHTSS** (1-888-544-4877), then refer to the <u>outage map provided by First Energy Group</u>. The First Energy online site shows outages in real time and gives you the ability to report your outage, see when a crew has been dispatched, an anticipated date and time for power to be back on , a call back or text when power returns and many other features.
