In addition, nominees must display community service, achieve academic excellence and be involved in their school's extra-curricular activities. A Message from Mayor Daniel J. Ursu

I am pleased to let you know that the City has negotiated and Council has passed necessary legislation for an aggregation contract with CEI that will reduce electric rates by 6%! Based on CEI figures of the average monthly bills for Richmond Heights residents, that results in a monthly savings of about \$5.40 for summer bills and about \$5.30 in winter. Although the vast majority of our residents use CEI, there will be an option to not join the program if a resident so chooses. On the timeline indicated by CEI, this rating system should be in place by about the end of summer. You can save even more on your bill by following the electricity conservation tips found on page 3 of this issue or visit www.energysavers.gov online for additional helpful hints.

As most of you are aware, municipal budgets have been severely impacted by the recent recession leading to reduced services. In our case, at the beginning of 2009, Richmond Heights laid off five police officers, three jail staff, and three part-time service department workers; reduced one full-time service department worker to part-time; reduced work week hours for Administration and Service Departments from 40 to 35 hours per week; decreased Department Head and Chiefs salaries back to 2006 levels or by about 16%; have given 0% wage increases in 2010; have not replaced a retired Building Commissioner and an open Firefighter position; have reduced overall Fire Department man hours; have reduced the full time Secretary position in the Building Department to part-time; and have cut Recreation by about 20%.

If you have been following media reports over the past few years, while municipal budgets are down, you are aware that costs for municipalities have increased dramatically. One area of rapid cost increase is garbage collection. For Richmond Heights, the cost for pick up has increased 94% over the past 3 years. In the hope of beginning to revive the decreased services to residents noted above, I fully expect that Council and I will pass legislation in the near future to begin about a \$1.96 per week or 28 cents per day garbage pick-up fee to be administered by Republic Waste or whoever is the current successful bidder on the Richmond Heights waste hauling contract. This will help to balance the budget. The City will continue to directly pay the disposal fees.

Further information is to follow on the CEI rate decrease program as well as the garbage fee implementation in the months ahead.

ENERGY SAVING TIPS

- replacing an old refrigerator (18 yrs or older) reduces electric usage by 35 percent
- vacuum clean the condenser coils on older refrigerators every 3 months
- chest-type freezers use up to 27% less energy than upright freezers
- use your microwave oven; they draw less than half the power than conventional ovens
- task lighting (over desks, tables, tool benches) eliminates the need to illuminate an entire room
- compact fluorescent bulbs use 75 percent less electricity; also use dimmer switches
- wash and rinse clothes in cold or warm water
- when drying clothes avoid overdrying
- run your dishwasher with a full load
- look for the Energy Star label when purchasing new appliances
- LCD tv's use much less electricity than a plasma tv

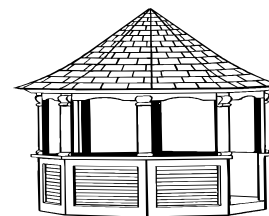
