KIWANIS LODGE INFO

The Kiwanis Lodge is located in the back of the Richmond Heights Community Park at 27285 Highland Road and is available for rental for Richmond Heights residents' parties only. The resident must be the contact for the party before, during and after the party. **DO NOT RENT THE HALL FOR SOMEONE ELSE!**

At the time of applying for rental of the Lodge, you must present two proofs of residency in Richmond Heights:

- 1) Driver's license
- 2) Current utility bill with Richmond Heights address

The hall(s) can be rented two (2) times per year per household

Payment for the Lodge is divided into two parts:

- 1) The refundable deposit
- 2) The rental fee

The refundable deposit is due when the application is filled out in the Recreation Office. The deposit is returned by mail to the resident if the staff finds no damages and all rules were followed by the renter.

The fee is due one month before the event. Payment may be made by check or cash previous to one month, but must be made in cash if it is made less than one month ahead.

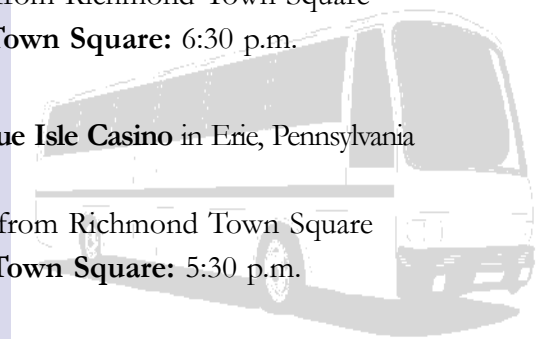

LOST PETS IN RICHMOND HEIGHTS

When you lose your dog or cat, what do you do? After some time in searching, do you give up; call the local pounds, put out ads? The first thing you should be doing is to call the Richmond Heights Police Department and leave a description of your dog or cat with them. Lately, the City has been finding way too many lost dogs and cats, and since the City really has no kennel facility, we have been forced to send all the lost dogs and cats to an animal control facility, which only holds the dogs and cats for a few short days before they are either shipped to a local pound or disposed of.

The City has seen many fine animals being sent away to this animal control facility, not knowing if they have families in the City looking for them or not. There are many problems here that could be fixed if only more residents had knowledge of this issue. The first and foremost problem is, these animals do not have any collars with ID tags on them. If they did, the Police would be calling their families as soon as they were picked up. Please make sure your pets have collars with their ID and phone number on them! The City does not enjoy sending them to the animal control facility, but feels they do not have much choice in the matter.

Secondly, please check your fence, gate, and home for areas where your dog can escape. Many of these dogs have probably escaped from fenced in areas that were not securely enclosed. Dogs should not really be left alone all day outside in the yard, especially when you are not home. That seems to be the best time for dogs to find a time to escape, which is when they are bored, lonely, hungry and thirsty, and have lots of time to find an escape route in the fences or dig their way out.

Thirdly, please make sure all your pets are neutered and spayed. Many pets desire to escape because they want to get out and visit with dogs and cats of the opposite sex. If your animal is neutered or spayed, the urge will not be as strong for them to run away. For a list of low cost spay and neuter clinics in the area, please call the Cleveland Spay Neuter Clinic at (216) 398-1081, at 4239 Fulton Road in Cleveland.
