

RESOLUTION NO. 30 -2017

A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE MAYOR TO ENTER INTO A SERVICE AGREEMENT WITH STRYKER MEDICAL DIVISION FOR THE INSPECTION, SUPPORT AND SERVICING OF CERTAIN DIVISION OF FIRE PATIENT MOVEMENT SYSTEMS.

WHEREAS, Council's Safety Committee has recommended entering into a service agreement with Stryker Medical Division for the inspection, support and servicing of one (1) Stryker model 6506 Power-PRO XT cot; one (1) Stryker model 6390 Power-LOAD system; and two (2) Stryker model 6252 Stair-Pro chairs assigned to the Division of Fire at a cost not to exceed \$3,167.00; and

WHEREAS, Stryker Medical Division has consistently provided the City's Division of Fire with on-site preventative maintenance services, overall excellent customer service in response to service calls, with prompt replacement of parts and equipment, all of which are included in such service agreement;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the City of Richmond Heights, State of Ohio, that:

Section 1: The Mayor is authorized to enter into a service agreement with Stryker Medical Division, in an amount not to exceed \$3,167.00 for a period of one (1) year, commencing on April 1, 2017 through March 31, 2018.

Section 2: The Director of Finance is authorized to appropriate to a proper account the amount necessary to cover the cost of the equipment that is the subject of Section 1 of this Resolution.

Section 3: It is found and determined that all formal actions of this Council concerning and relating to the adoption of this Resolution were adopted in an open meeting of this Council, and that all deliberations of this Council and any of its committees that resulted in such formal action, were in meetings open to the public, in compliance with all legal requirements, including Section 121.22 of the Ohio Revised Code.

Section 4: This Resolution shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.
