A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE MAYOR TO ENTER INTO AN AGREEMENT WITH F.M.R./FACILITIES MAINTENANCE & REPAIR FOR THE PURCHASE OF THREE REPLACEMENT DOORS AND FRAMES FOR THE KIWANIS LODGE.

WHEREAS, the Director of Public Service has obtained a quote from F.M.R./Facilities Maintenance & Repair ("FMR") for the purchase of three (3) steel doors and frames to replace existing doors at the Kiwanis Lodge in an amount not to exceed Four Thousand Dollars (\$4,000.00);

WHEREAS, Council's Service and Recreation Committee has recommended that Council authorize the Mayor to enter into an agreement with FMR for the purchase of three (3) steel doors and frames for the Kiwanis Lodge in an amount not to exceed Four Thousand Dollars (\$4,000.00);

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the City of Richmond Heights, State of Ohio, that:


Section 1: The Mayor is authorized to enter into a contract with FMR for the purchase of three (3) steel doors and frames to replace existing doors at the Kiwanis Lodge as set forth in the recitals to this Resolution for a cost not to exceed Four Thousand Dollars (\$4,000.00).

Section 2: If necessary, the Director of Finance is authorized and directed to appropriate to a proper account a sum sufficient to cover the cost of the purchase referred to in Section 1 above.

Section 3: It is found and determined that all formal actions of this Council concerning and relating to the adoption of this Resolution were adopted in an open meeting of this Council, and that all deliberations of this Council and any of its committees that resulted in such formal action, were in meetings open to the public, in compliance with all legal requirements, including Section 121.22 of the Ohio Revised Code.

Section 4: This Resolution shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.
