

RESOLUTION NO.: 54 -2022  
INTRODUCED BY: Lentine

A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE MAYOR TO ENTER INTO A PURCHASE AGREEMENT WITH STRYKER MEDICAL DIVISION FOR THE PURCHASE OF ONE POWER-PRO 2 AMBULANCE COT FOR THE DIVISION OF FIRE UTILIZING AMERICAN RESCUE PLAN ACT FUNDS.

WHEREAS, due to new EMS standards designed to increase safety and reduce injuries, all ambulances must be equipped with patient cot loading systems;

WHEREAS, the Division of Fire has requested and the Council's Safety Committee has recommended the purchase of a Power-PRO 2 ambulance cot at a cost not to exceed Thirty Thousand Dollars (\$30,000.00) from the Local Fiscal Recovery Fund created to deposit American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) funds;

WHEREAS, Stryker Medical Division of Portage, Michigan is the sole source of the aforesaid ambulance cot system and is the system installed in the City's ambulances permitting the interchangeable use of either ambulance for the type of cot used in that system.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the City of Richmond Heights, State of Ohio, that:

Section 1: The Mayor is authorized to enter into an agreement with Stryker Medical Division for the purchase of one Power-PRO 2 Ambulance Cot, and related accessories for the Division of Fire at a total cost not to exceed \$30,000 coming from the Local Fiscal Recovery Fund.


Section 2: The Director of Finance is authorized to expend funds from the Local Fiscal Recovery Fund in the amount deemed necessary to cover the cost for the purchase of the equipment as set forth in Section 1 above.

Section 3: It is found and determined that all formal actions of this Council concerning and relating to the adoption of this Resolution were adopted in an open meeting of this Council, and that all deliberations of this Council and any of its committees that resulted in such formal action, were in meetings open to the public, in compliance with all legal requirements, including Section 121.22 of the Ohio Revised Code.


Section 4: This Resolution shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.
