**A RESOLUTION ADOPTING THE CUYAHOGA COUNTY 2022-2027 ALL HAZARDS
MITIGATION PLAN**

WHEREAS, the *City of Richmond Heights*, Cuyahoga County, Ohio is most vulnerable to natural and human-made hazards which may result in loss of life and property, economic hardship, and threats to public health and safety;

WHEREAS, Section 322 of the Disaster Mitigation Act of 2000 (DMA 2000) requires state and local governments to develop and submit for approval to the President a mitigation plan that outlines processes for identifying their respective natural hazards, risks, and vulnerabilities;

WHEREAS, the *City of Richmond Heights* acknowledges the requirements of Section 322 of DMA 2000 to have an approved Hazard Mitigation Plan as a prerequisite to receiving post-disaster Hazard Mitigation Grant Program funds;

WHEREAS, the Cuyahoga County 2022-2027 All-Hazards Mitigation Plan has been developed by the Cuyahoga County Office of Emergency Management in cooperation with other county departments, and officials and citizens of the *City of Richmond Heights*;

WHEREAS, a public involvement process consistent with the requirements of DMA 2000 was conducted to develop the Cuyahoga County 2022-2027 All-Hazards Mitigation Plan; and

WHEREAS, the Cuyahoga County 2022-2027 All-Hazards Mitigation Plan recommends mitigation activities that will reduce losses to life and property affected by both natural hazards that face the County and its municipal governments,

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the City of Richmond Heights, Cuyahoga County, Ohio, that:

Section 1: The Cuyahoga County 2022-2027 All-Hazards Mitigation Plan as approved and amended as required in the future is hereby adopted as the official Hazard Mitigation Plan of the *City of Richmond Heights*; and

The respective officials and agencies identified in the implementation strategy of the Cuyahoga County 2022-2027 All-Hazards Mitigation Plan are hereby directed to implement the recommended activities assigned to them.

Section 2: All formal actions and deliberations of Council and its committees relating to the passage of this Resolution that resulted in formal action were in meetings open to the public as required by law.


Section 3: This Resolution shall take effect and be in force at the earliest time permitted by law.


