**A RESOLUTION CONFIRMING THE APPOINTMENT BY THE MAYOR
OF MARYBETH MUEHLE AS A MEMBER OF THE CIVIL SERVICE
COMMISSION OF THE CITY.**

WHEREAS, the Mayor of the City of Richmond Heights, in accordance with Section 6 of Article VI of the City Charter, has authority to appoint members of the Civil Service Commission of the City and has requested that Council confirm the appointment of Marybeth Muehle to said Commission to complete an unexpired term, which term commenced December 31, 2019 and runs through December 31, 2025;


NOW, THEREFORE, Be It Resolved by the Council of the City of Richmond Heights, State of Ohio, that:

Section 2: It is found and determined that all formal actions of this Council concerning and relating to the adoption of this Resolution were adopted in an open meeting of this Council, and that all deliberations of this Council and any of its committees that resulted in such formal action, were in meetings open to the public, in compliance with all legal requirements, including Section 121.22 of the Ohio Revised Code.

Section 3: This Resolution shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and signature by the Mayor.
