NOW, THEREFORE, Be It Resolved by the Council of the City of Richmond Heights, State of Ohio, that:







## MIA MOORE

### Bio

Mia is twenty-two-year resident of the City of Richmond Heights. She currently serves as a Street Representative for the Richmond Bluffs Homeowners Association.

Mia is a wife and mother of two sons and two stepsons. Her two sons graduated from Richmond Heights City School District. Both are graduates of state universities.

Mia holds a Bachelor of Science/Marketing Degree from Dyke College, also known as Chancellor University, now defunct.

She began her career at the Illuminating Company as a typist. Upon college graduation, Mia moved into the Budget and Statistical company department, then, the Residential and Commercial Sales department in the Cleveland Electric Illuminating and Toledo Edison service territories. In her position, she was involved in such projects as the Cleveland Federal Building construction, upgrades to the electrical network systems for renovation of downtown Cleveland buildings, including The Colonnade Arcade, The Sherwin Williams Headquarters, the Holiday Inn Express and renovations of several Cleveland Metropolitan Housing Authority campuses. Mia's position required the determination of electric service needs based on electric engineering design, she worked with developers, architects, and builders to achieve these goals, and the creation of electric service requisitions to these facilities. Her position also included the monitoring of the electric service design and installation until complete. Mia's duties in the Sales Departments lasted for 19 years.

Mia was then promoted to an External Affairs Manager position, where she became a corporate diplomat responsible for communicating electric energy ideas and policy to elected and public officials and generating support from both. Mia worked with Emergency Management Agencies of various counties to aid them in understanding electric utility protocol during emergencies and to develop working performance standards that allow the utility to aid in the safe delivery and maintenance of electric power. Mia was also a member of the Perry Nuclear Power Public Information Organization where she performed these duties in the Cuyahoga and Ashtabula Counties for 10 years.

Mia was lastly promoted to Director of External Affairs where she managed teams in the Illuminating Company and Toledo Edison Service Territory. She performed this position until her retirement in 2014.

During her years of employment at FirstEnergy, Mia became a member of the Board of Directors of the following organizations: Cleveland Leadership Center of Cleveland, Geauga County Leadership Center, The United Black Fund of Cleveland, The Cleveland Foundation's Minority Arts and Education Fund Subcommittee, the United Way Services of Geauga County, Geauga County Habitat for Humanity, Geauga County Growth Partnership Charter Member, Heights Hillcrest Chamber of Commerce, Advisory Board Member of the University Hospital System of Geauga County, Advisory Board Member of the Kent State University Geauga County Campus, Geauga County Department of Aging. Mia received the YWCA Women of Achievement Award, which is a recognition of women in leadership positions and who support the community.
