Working Smoke Detectors Save Lives!

On Saturday, October 12, 2019 The American Red Cross, the Selman Company and other volunteers partnered with the Richmond Heights FD for a smoke detector install event to promote a safety culture in our community. "Sound the Alarm" is a nationwide program sponsored by The American Red Cross which provides home fire safety education and smoke alarm installations to local communities. Over the last five years, home visits have accomplished so much, including the installation of more than 1.8 million smoke alarms and preparing more than 1 million people against home fires. On Saturday we were able to install 222 alarms in 83 homes in Richmond Heights! If you would like to have a smoke detector installed in your home you can call (216) 383-6325.

One thing we can all do to help is to refrain from feeding the deer; Not only out of respect for your neighborhood but because it is against the law (**505.21 FEEDING OF NUISANCE ANIMALS PROHIBITED; EXEMPTIONS; SECURE OUTDOOR STORAGE OF REFUSE OR WASTE**). The risks from deer are a serious concern particularly with regards to traffic accidents and exposure to ticks which can carry Lyme disease. Secondary concerns involve their destruction of residents' plants and vegetation. We truly appreciate your attention to and cooperation in this matter.
