2020 Census – Respond Your Way

The 2020 Census is happening now. Help shape your future, and your community's future, by responding to the 2020 Census. Homes began receiving their invitation to respond to the 2020 Census between March 12-20. These official Census Bureau mailings include detailed information and a Census ID for completing the Census online. **You can complete your questionnaire online, by phone, or by mail. Every person counted matters!**

Each individual has a tremendous effect on funding for vital programs and services used by residents of Cuyahoga County. For every person not counted in Ohio, \$1,814 is lost in funds that would go toward these programs and resources. The official census results are also used to determine how many seats Ohio receives in the U.S. House of Representatives. If Cuyahoga County is undercounted, Ohio could receive fewer seats in the House of Representatives as a result.

City and County Planners also use census data to plan for hospitals, nursing homes, and other clinics. Cuyahoga County and State of Ohio agencies rely on census data to build new roads and repair our infrastructure. Cleveland Metropolitan School District and other regional Public School districts even use census information to draw school district boundaries.
