Welcome to our e-newsletter publication. **We ask our residents to keep up to date with the latest information through the [Cuyahoga County Board of Health's page](#).** The Ohio Department of Health (ODH) has opened a coronavirus (COVID-19) public hotline, reachable seven days a week from 9 a.m. to 8 p.m. at 1-833-4-ASK-ODH (1-833-427-5634).

On April 2.2020 the Mayor signed an [Executive Order Declaring a State of Emergency](#) for the City of Richmond Heights.

If you would like to be notified of local emergencies consider registering for the Cuyahoga Ready Notify system, a county wide mass notification system offering rapid, accurate information regarding emergency, government news, safety, water boil alerts, and closures.
